## Commemorative Certificate 1883 to 1993



The N.S.W. Division of the A.F.U.L.E. commenced on 2nd January 1883 with the first meeting held at the Friends Hotel at Redfern.

This meeting was to mark the beginning of a fine history of Service and Achievement for the Enginemen of N.S.W. spanning 110 years.

During the history of the Union, members endured many harsh conditions as they actively joined in the struggles to support their Union and each other in the true spirit of Trade Unionism. The members became justifiably proud of their Union during the long history of service and achievement and evinced a high degree of solidarity.

Finally, due to falling membership in the Railway Industry a decision tinged with sadness and reluctance was made by the membership of the Union to commit the A.F.U.L.E. to its final challenge by embarking upon an amalgamation with other Public Sector Transport Unions to form the Public Transport Union commencing on March 1st 1993.

This certificate is produced by Authority of the N.S.W. Divisional Council to mark the passing into history of a proud Union dedicated to achievements for Enginemen of N.S.W. from 2nd January 1883 to 1st March 1993.
