Maitland Steamfest, 2014

Elaine and John Boxer attended the Maitland Steamfest last April and comment that it's "Well worth a visit for those who have not yet been to Maitland Steam Fest".

Elaine further comments....

"One of the main features of the annual Steam Fest at Maitland is the Great Train Race. The race is between two vintage steam trains with their carriages and a Tiger Moth plane, starting at Broadmeadow and ending at Maitland Railway Station.

It is a very exciting race with the engines going as fast as the stokers can keep the coal up to the boilers. There is a great sense of competition between the two trains, with passengers exhorting the engine driver to over-take the other train, booing the opposition and much waving and cheering. The staff on the trains are also very helpful in assisting the passengers to take photographs and generally provide historical information about the trains.



The main rally ground at the steamfest also has great displays of miniature trains, traction engines, both stationary and mobile, and displays of vintage vehicles. There are also the usual stalls and fun fair rides for the younger generation".

Goulburn Roundhouse

Sunday 18th May saw Col & Glenda Bembrick pay a flying visit to the Goulburn roundhouse where we were warmly received by members of the Goulburn Loco Roundhouse Preservation Society. We were given a conducted tour by Treasurer John Proctor and met President Dale Wake plus several other members. Of prime interest to us was the condition of CPH13 which is being restored (on behalf of OTHR) by the Goodwin Alco group. Steve Preston is directing this operation.

The exterior of the rail motor needs considerable work but the interior is in surprisingly good condition (see photo). At the current time, mechanical parts are being sourced to bring the unit back into running order, but there is quite a bit of work still to do!

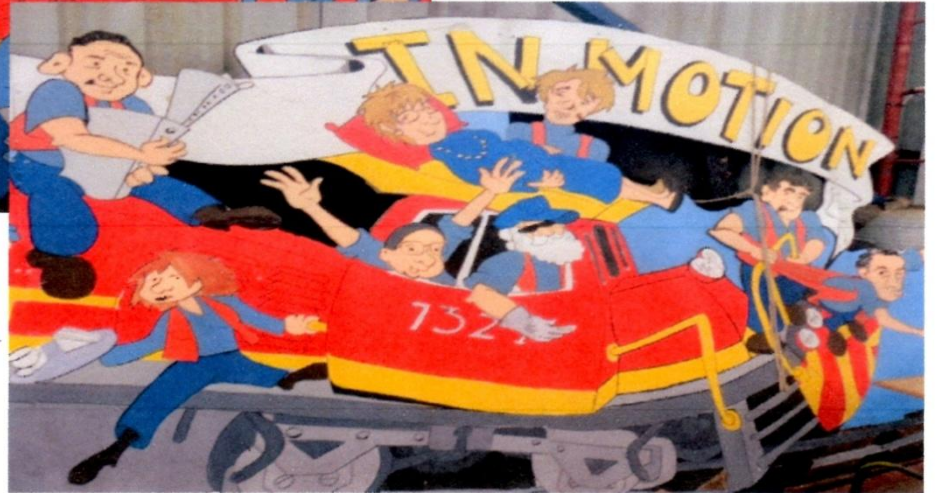
