
To assist with catering arrangements we need to know numbers who will be attending. Please contact our secretary, Margaret Conners (see details above) if you plan to join us.

What a wonderful year we've had. To summarise: ς OTHR has gone from strength to strength and our membership is now 219 and still growing.

- ς OTHR won an award from the Office of Rail Heritage for the quality of our restoration work on the track.
- ς Our dedicated board under the leadership of President Shane Moorhead has worked professionally throughout the year on a great variety of projects.
- ς Monthly meetings have been very well attended.
- ς Above all, our incredibly dedicated and skilled workers have made amazing progress on restoring the line.
- ς The last long working bee on 3^{rd} – 10^{th} November is a good example of the grit and determination of our group. Every day 12-15 volunteers worked non-stop in cold, wet or windy weather. The team concentrated on pinning sleepers that had been previously laid with over 4,000 dog spikes and in addition, 400 damaged sleepers were removed and replaced. Drainage and earthworks have been completed at the Hazelgrove end of the line so hopefully the SWAMP has gone! Many thanks to our Track Manager, Peter Culley for his tireless work and organisation.
- ς Continued wonderful catering efforts from our enthusiastic catering team has been a feature of all working bees.

ς Finally, our grateful thanks must go to all of those local businesses, organisations and individuals who have donated time, machinery and food items for our working bees.
