

A committee is scheduled for Wednesday 12th July. One of the agenda items will be the training areas and program that must take place over the coming months.

Initially we will be concentrating on

- First Aid
- Safe working requirements.
- Carriage attendants, Guards, Station Master
- Operations Manager Responsibilities

We will also have to consider medical certificates for some of the positions mentioned above.

If you are interested in any of the areas above please let us know as soon as possible. When operations start we will need more members to volunteer. I can assure you that these positions will be less onerous and much more interesting than track work and vegetation control that will also have to continue.

Driver training will take place when we have achieved the variation of accreditation from ONRSR to operate North of Albion Street.

Locomotives 7307 and 7321 have had preliminary certification work. Each axle has been through an ultra-sound and all passed the test process. There is still maintenance work to be completed before the locos are certified fit for use.

Thank you to those who have already renewed their membership for 2023-2024. It is pleasing to see that many of the renewals and application for new memberships have taken the opportunity to donate as well.

Round three of the One Hundred club has been drawn and the winning number was purchased by Alice Perrott of Black Springs. Oberon's Pioneer Walking Track.



Oberon Council, in conjunction with Oberon Tarana Heritage Railway in redeveloping the Oberon Pioneer Walking Track.

The track runs beside the Oberon to Hazelgrove leg of OTHR's project (Stage 1). The track follows a very picturesque route through Oberon's countryside. It starts at the Oberon Railway Precinct and will terminate at the proposed picnic area at Hazelgrove, a distance of approx. 5.6K.

The track will offer fantastic viewing spots of passing trains. It will also allow enthusiastic visitors to walk or cycle and catch the train back to their starting point.

Oberon Council is upgrading the track as funds permit with an initial approx. 1K now concreted. The council is an enthusiastic partner in the establishment of OTHR's project that will provide visitor experiences second to none.

Important information about moving rolling stock:

Shunting in the yard will not be frequent but regular as movements are required. Typically shunting would occur in bringing rolling stock to the station for display at open days, special events and rallies.

Medicals:

The level of certification depends on your level of interest.

- Driver Level 1 medical certificate
 TMV operator Level 2 medical certificate.
- For all volunteers there is a site induction and further training depending on the type of volunteer assistance you wish to undertake.
- OTHR needs to comply with the guidelines of ONRSR – the Office of the National Rail Safety Regulator and other Laws either Federal or State.

Our Code

Oberon Tarana Heritage Railway Inc. (OTHR) is a not for profit, member-based organisation. We have a responsibility to strive to make informed, consistent, and ethical decisions.

Our code is a public statement that OTHR is committed to doing the right things the right way. Our code applies to all OTHR committee members and members.

We are proud of our culture, and understand it is continually shaped by the behaviours and attitudes demonstrated on a day-to-day basis by all our people.

Our code includes references to relevant OTHR requirements (OTHR policies and procedures) and other helpful tools and resources.

No code of conduct can ever cover every situation, OTHR relies on you to use sound judgement and speak up when you have questions or concerns.

All committee members, members, volunteers, and employees of OTHR are representatives of OTHR and are expected to act responsibly and professionally.

As a representative of OTHR, you are expected to act in the best interests of OTHR and to conduct yourself in a manner that does not discredit:

- An individual team member, having regard to their position held within OTHR, or
- The reputation of OTHR.

Whenever here is conflict or a difference between an applicable legal requirement and Our Code, you must apply the strictest standard.

Our partners, and third parties, can also have a direct impact on the reputation of OTHR through their behaviours and actions. For this reason, we want to work with our partners to ensure that they share our commitment to safety, ethics, and compliance. We also expect and encourage all our contractors and their employees to act in a way that is consistent with Our Code. We will take appropriate measures where we believe they have not met our expectations or their contractual obligations.

Our volunteers have started to put the safety fence in place. When finished access for the frail and disabled visitors to our precinct will be greatly improved.
