President's Message

Vice-president Michael Clark finished the work on HLF854 on the Wednesday 31 January. This was just in time to build the consist of carriages for the trip to the station platform for the February Open Day. Many more visitors attended and morning teas and merchandise sales were very encouraging.

With the improvements to the End Platform Cars behind us the restoration work on HS36 has commenced. The main focus at the moment is repairing the roof and guttering.

Vegetation control has continued during the last month. All of the track in the Oberon yard and that from Albion Street to the Hazelgrove stop block has been completed. We are trying to find a "good weather day" to deal with the noxious weeds Blackberry and St John's Wort in various parts of the corridor.

Work on the Hazelgrove loop line has continued but there have been some minor difficulties to overcome – the most significant being a problem with the cess and drainage next to the position of the southern turnout which has been addressed. We are hoping that the laying of the loop and southern turnout will be completed by the end of the February. There will then be work to complete on installing ground frames and rodding.

In recent times David McMurray has resigned from his position on the committee and OTHR. I would like to thank David for his contribution over the past ten years. The position of secretary has been filled by Elaine Boxer, a current committee member. Elaine was the secretary for many of the years between 2012 and 2017.

New type of Carriage.

"National Advocate, Thursday 6 March 1941.

A new type of carriage is now in service on the Oberon – Tarana railway. The carriage is a combination of a guard's van and passenger coach having accommodation for 40 passengers and will be of ample capacity for the average needs of the service to Oberon...."

This is most likely a reference to HS36 now back in the OTHR Rolling Stock Shed and now being restored. On restoration it will once again be put into service on the Oberon to Hazelgrove section of the Oberon to Tarana Railway line.

Important information about moving rolling stock:

Shunting in the yard will not be frequent but regular as movements are required. Typically shunting would occur in bringing rolling stock to the station for display at open days, special events and rallies.

Medicals:

The level of certification depends on your level of interest.

- Driver Level 1 medical certificate
 - TMV operator Level 2 medical certificate.
- For all volunteers there is a site induction and further training depending on the type of volunteer assistance you wish to undertake.
- OTHR needs to comply with the guidelines of ONRSR the Office of the National Rail Safety Regulator and other Laws either Federal or State.
