# **Purpose**

To prescribe the responsibilities of *Train Controllers* in the Oberon Tarana Heritage Railway (OTHR) Network.

# Responsibilities

The primary responsibility of the Train Controller is to manage *train* paths for the safe and efficient *transit* of *rail traffic* through the OTHR Network.

Train Controller *must* plan, set priorities for and manage:

- train services
- work on track authorities
- Proceed Authorities
- liaison with relevant Operators and Maintenance Representatives and external services during incident management
- available facilities to restore train services safely and promptly.

Train Controllers must:

- respond to equipment failures and warning alarms
- promptly report breaches of OTHR Network Rules and Network Procedures to the Network Operations Manager and affected Operator's Representatives.

Train Controllers must compile and maintain, in *permanent form*, relevant records and reports about conditions and movements in the OTHR Network.
