
A NEW RECEPTION BUILDING FOR OTHR

Since November 2022 OTHR has been negotiating with the powers that be to gain permission to erect a new reception building in our carpark area. Based on a stock NSW Railways freight shed, the 1985 photo by James McInerney shows the Canowindra Shed as an example. Our new building will eventually contain facilities for us to cater for the growing number of visitors we expect once we commence running trains.

Toilets, cafe, ticketing, merchandising and office areas will all be included in the building. It will enable us to process up to 100 people at any one time, as well as providing a venue for special events off the train. Endless hurdles and delays have now put the project in jeopardy. Funding for this project is coming from a Government Bushfire Recovery Grant which is due to expire at the end of March this year. The Development Application is now with Oberon Council, and is going through the Heritage part of the approval. Once the DA is approved we hope to be granted a construction certificate which will enable us to get the slab down before the end of March. Everything is riding on this approval. If it doesn't arrive in time we will forfeit the grant money. The building will be put on hold until we can raise the necessary funds to start again.

This project has been a rude awakening into the duplicity of government structures. We have had to deal with UGL regional Linx, Transport for NSW, NSW Department of Heritage and Environment, and Oberon Council. 5 separate Heritage officers. 2 years off chasing departments, Sending and resending documentation to the same department because someone dealing with our case left leaving no trace of what had gone before. So here we are in February, already, with a ticking clock moving us relentlessly to the end of March. Will we make it? Michael O'Kane. Project Manager

Medicals:

The level of certification depends on your level of interest.

- Driver Level 1 medical certificate TMV operator Level 2 medical certificate.
- For all volunteers there is a site induction and further training depending on the type of volunteer assistance you wish to undertake.
- OTHR needs to comply with the guidelines of ONRSR the Office of the National Rail Safety Regulator and other Laws either Federal or State.

More on Hazelgrove


