COMMS Development Project Oberon to Hazelgrove

Committee Activities

The comiltee has a monthly meeting on the second Wednesday of each month at 10.30 to 12 pm in the Oberon Community Centre Library. These meeting involve reports from committee members who have particular responsibilities for the various projects that are in place – for examples, a treasurers report, track managers report, and Hazelgrove Station development report.

During the year we have had full day meetings with ONRSR for auditing purposes. We scheduled a meeting 10 am to 4 pm for last Wednesday to prepare the documentation for a variation of accrediatation to run track maintenance vehicles to Hazelgrove. It was a good day ang we made great progress. New ideas surfaced and how to deal with the risks associated in taking rolling stock out of the yard became evident. The meeting closed promptlly at 4.00 pm but we are having another session next Wednesday to get everything ready for completion of the variation application.

We have been invited to participate in microsoft teams meeting with THNSW (Tranport Heritege New South Wales) ATHRA (Association of Tourist and Heritege Railways) and more recently RISSB (Rail Industry Safety & Standards Board). These meetings are very important because the main agenda itemss are concerned with safe operating principles in heritage rail. THNSW have two sector meetings each which bring representatives from most of the heritage rail groups in NSW. They are held on Saturdays at conveninent locations in Sydney.

HS36 for August Newsletter.

Work continues on HS36 albeit a bit slower due to the lovely winter temperatures here in Oberon. It is a little difficult to work with hand tools when the temperature doesn't exceed four degrees all day in the rolling stock shed. Still, we press on.

Most recent works involved repairs to the outer eastern framework between compartments C36 and D36.

Quite a bit of rot and degraded timber had to be cut out and new timbers spliced in. Many old nail and screw holes glued and dowelled to present the frame ready for its new covering of two inch matchboard.

The first testing of lighting wiring was performed in compartment D36. Everything working as planned.





Visit by Paul Toole

Paul Toole visited to discuss the Heritage Grant "Caring for State Heritage" 25-27SHR135 of \$14,490 (ex GST) for repairs to the windows and parcel room doors of the Heritage Station Building. The weather on the north western sides of the building has been the major cause of the obvious deterioration over time. The repairs are well underway in Dave Turek's Joinery Workshop in O'Connell.

Fortunately, it stopped snowing just as Paul got out his car in the car park. He was able to inspect the scope of works on the building. I should have arrived about an hour and a half earlier and lit the fire in the station building. It was very unpleasant outside.

We also discussed the regulatory changes to the Health Standard for Rail Safety Workers particularly those who need a category one certificate for the roles they have as volunteers in Heritage Railways. The expense of the new medical certificates may influence the volunteers who work in the smaller heritage group and must personally fund the doctor's certification appointments. It may even reduce the numbers who can volunteer! Paul did alert The Hon Jenny Aitchison MP, Minister for Roads, and Minister for Regional Transport. She suggested we take our concerns to the National Transport Commission. The matter is being followed up by several Heritage Rail Groups from each State.

At the meeting, members will have the opportunity to:

- find out about OTHR's operations and finances
- ask questions about the operations and finances
- · speak about any items on the agenda
- vote on any resolutions proposed.

At the meeting, members will be asked to vote to:

- to confirm the minutes of the last annual general meeting
- to receive from the committee reports on the activities of the association during the proceeding financial year.
- to receive and consider the annual financial statement.

Sections from the OTHR constitution relevant to AGM

14 Composition and membership of committee

- (1) The committee is to consist of:
- (a) the office-bearers of the association, and
- (b) at least 3 ordinary committee members,

each of whom is to be elected at the annual general meeting of the association under clause 15.

Note. Section 28 of the Act contains further requirements concerning eligibility for membership and composition of the committee.

- (2) The total number of committee members is to be 7.
- (3) The office-bearers of the association are as follows:
 - (a) the president, (b) the vice-president, (c) the treasurer, (d) the secretary.
- (4) A committee member may hold up to 2 offices (other than both the offices of president and vice-president).
- (5) There is no maximum number of consecutive terms for which a committee member may hold office
- (6) Each member of the committee is, subject to this constitution, to hold office until immediately before the election of committee members at the annual general meeting next following the date of the member's election, and is eligible for re-election.

Section 15 of the Constitution Election of committee members

- (1) Nominations of candidates for election as office-bearers of the association or as ordinary committee members:
 - (a) must be made in writing, signed by 2 members of the association, and accompanied by the written consent of the candidate (which may be endorsed on the form of the nomination), and
 - (b) must be delivered to the secretary of the association at least 7 days before the date fixed for the holding of the annual general meeting at which the election is to take place.
