OTHR is committed to continually improving our rail safety performance by establishing objectives, implementing plans, measuring performance, and reviewing progress by:

- Developing and implementing an effective Safety Management System.
- Monitoring and auditing compliance with the Safety Management System.
- Complying with legislative requirements and best practice industry standards.
- Identifying, and analysing safety risks and implementing controls to mitigate risk.
- Developing a Safety Culture of commitment, good communication and trust.
- Developing standards and procedures for the operation and maintenance of rail assets.
- Ensuring that members, volunteers, and contractors are trained and competent.

We are all responsible and accountable for safety.

Oberon Tarana Heritage Railway is committed to our duty of care for the health and safety of our members, volunteers, and contractors with a goal to eliminate work related injuries and illness by:

- Understanding the specific health and safety responsibilities of operating the OTHR.
- Complying with Work Health and Safety Legislative requirements.

- Encouraging consultation and cooperation between management, members, volunteers, and contractors on matters that affect health and safety.
